# Selkirk set to host 37th annual 55 Plus Games in 2020

Selkirk has officially been selected to host Active Aging in Manitoba's 37th annual 55 Plus Games next year.

The city previously hosted the games in 2001, and local volunteers are now gearing up for the three-day event, which will take place June 16 to 18, 2020.

The games, which are hosted in a different community in Manitoba each year, consist of more than 20 age-friendly events that attract more than 1,000 athletes, 300 volunteers and hundreds of spectators. Events range from card games to scrabble, cribbage, arts and crafts, shuffleboard, track, swimming and slo-pitch. A curling event, which will also be part of the games, will be held at the end of March, 2020 in Selkirk.

Deborah Vitt, co-chair of Selkirk's host committee, said the games are all about embracing aging, bringing seniors together and they offer something for everyone and all skill levels.

"I'm really stoked. The more I get involved with it, the more I learn about it, the more I know the wide scope of involvement from participants from 55 plus, it's really exciting," Vitt said while sitting inside the Gordon Howard Centre last Wednesday. "It's not about being a qualifier for the Olympics, it's about what can I do to participate and enhance my own life in terms of energy, mind, body, spirit ... and connecting in the community."

Gerry Hamm, co-chair of the host committee, said the games will be coming off the heels of the Gordon Howard Centre's 40th anniversary and Manitoba's 150th anniversary.

Vitt added Lee Hanson of the Gordon Howard Centre has been instrumental in moving Selkirk's bid for the games forward. They have also received plenty of support from the City of Selkirk.

"Selkirk has got a reputation for keen volunteers, lots who have al-

ready been tapped to sit on the organizing committee," Vitt said.

The host committee will be looking to recruit around 300 volunteers to help with the games. They are also hoping to raise roughly \$40,000 with support from local businesses and donors.

The host committee will be hosting an event on Oct. 9 from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Gordon Howard Centre for those interested in volunteering. They will also be handing out information about the games during the Selkirk Biz Fair and Rodeo Parade on Saturday, July 13.

Vitt said most of the games will be held within the City of Selkirk and surrounding area communities. Events will be held in Selkirk Park, the Selkirk Curling Club, Gordon Howard Centre, Selkirk Golf and Country Club, the Comp, the Selkirk Waterfront as well as the Selkirk Rec Complex, just to name a few.

Although the games emphasize active and recreational activities, they are also about providing a social and cultural atmosphere through entertainment and social events. A Variety

Concert will be held on the Tuesday night and an Athletes' Banquet will take place on the Wednesday evening. The banquet includes a dinner, dance and speeches by local dignitaries.

Vitt said participants, volunteers, spectators and sponsors are all needed to make the games a success in Selkirk.

Registration for the games will begin in March, 2020 and forms can be found online at [activeagingmb.ca](http://activeagingmb.ca) or by calling the games office at 204-261-9257. The games are open to Manitobans who are 55 or older by Dec. 31 the year of the games.

Jim Evanchuk, Active Aging in Manitoba executive director, said they are looking forward to another successful games in Selkirk. He added the games will also be a chance to showcase the entire city and what it has to offer.

"Selkirk's proximity to Winnipeg is also going to make a very big difference. We have a lot of senior groups and clubs that we will be promoting so we anticipate a spike in the participation levels of older adults," Evanchuk said. "So we're definitely looking forward to the celebration in Selkirk next year."

# Triple S Fair and Rodeo rides into Selkirk this weekend

The Triple S Fair and Rodeo will be riding into Selkirk this Friday, July 12, bringing three days of action packed entertainment along with it.

The event, presented by the St. Andrews and St. Clements Agricultural Society, brings midway games, ATV and truck mud racing, dog agility and rodeo performances together for a fantastic weekend in Selkirk Park. The rodeo itself draws horse riders from across the prairies to compete in events such as barrel racing.

The festivities will kick off on Friday at 11 a.m. with a Children's Festival presented by the RM of St. Andrews and RM of St. Clements. The event, which will run until 4 p.m., will feature Prairie Wildlife Rehabilitation Centre, a petting zoo, Eric the Juggler, and balloons. Select Shows Midway will open at 2 p.m. and a Wild Dog performance will start at 3 p.m. Past

The Perimeter will also be performing in the beer garden beginning at 9 p.m.

On Saturday, July 13, the festivities will begin with the Selkirk Biz Parade at 10 a.m. along Manitoba Avenue. On Sunday, July 14, events will kick off at 10 a.m. with 4D barrel racing and run until around 3 p.m. For a full schedule

The event is 100 per cent volunteer run and organizers are hoping a new generation of volunteers will help take it over.

Rea Pennington, president of the rodeo's board of directors and one of the event's organizers, said they're hoping to find some volunteers who love the rodeo as much as they do.

"We'll never turn a volunteer down. We're always open to new board members as well. We want to find people who love the rodeo as much as we do," Pennington said. "It's a lot of work, but we enjoy putting it on. Without (the current board), there wouldn't be a fair."

Pennington said the event is costly and very time-consuming to run, but added it's been rewarding watching the event grow each year. Pennington doesn't have exact numbers for at-

tendance, but estimates that roughly 9,000 people attended last year's rodeo.

One of the new events this year is the Ricklyn's Farms Petting Zoo. Families can enjoy petting chickens, pigs, horses and other farm animals. The petting zoo, dog agility shows and the children's festival are free to attend, but the rodeo costs \$10 a day for adults and \$5 a day for children.

This year's rodeo will also have 4D barrel racing and pole bending, where a rider makes a horse run around a series of poles as fast as possible, in a special formation, similar to barrel racing.

Pennington said they hope to keep the event running as long as possible.

"It's one of those things where you just keep doing it every year. We love the fair and we want to see it continue to grow. But it's a lot of work," Pennington said. "If you're interested at all, please get in touch, we will never turn down a volunteer."

# Cityfolk Farm to host 4th annual Homesteader Festival

A family farm near Thalberg, Man. is gearing up to host the fourth annual DIY Homesteader Festival presented by Home Hardware Selkirk next month.

Kris Antonius, who runs the festival along with her husband, Mike Berg, at Cityfolk Farm, says they started the event as a response to the growing interest in reclaiming skills of the past, reconnecting with the land, and cultivating community with a focus on a DIY lifestyle.

This year's two-day festival, which takes place on Saturday, Aug. 10 and Sunday, Aug. 11, will feature more than 30 workshops covering a wide range of topics, a DIY kids area, an artisan market and trade show with more than 40 vendors, homegrown Manitoba music, and a local foods lunch. Tickets went on sale in early June and Kris says the event is garnering interest from across Canada.

"It's really becoming a national event and we're pretty excited to be hosting all of these people who are interested in creating a connection with the land," Kris said. "The positive energy, community vibe and sharing of skills at the fest is a testament to the attitude and values within the hearts of urban and rural homesteaders."

This year's festival will feature more

than 30 workshops and demos covering everything from how to keep bees with Beeproject Apiaries to wild plants and basketry with Praire Shore Botanicals to Mushroom Cultivation with River City Mushrooms to Hide Tanning with Manitoba Buckskin. This year, Zach Loeks is the 2019 featured teacher. Loeks hails from the Ottawa Valley, and is a farmer, permaculture designer and educator, and author of "The Permaculture Market Garden."

"The folks that come out to the fest are going to leave inspired about how easy and gratifying it can be to make

or grow what you need," Kris said. "We believe that we can have stronger, healthier, more resilient people and communities when we connect around these skills."

Cityfolk Farm is located near Thalberg, Man., which is roughly 50 kilometres north of Selkirk.

This year, a percentage of the proceeds from the event will be donated to the Brokenhead Wetland Trail. There will also be a special guided tour of the trail for a small fee on the Saturday evening.

"There's something simultaneously

energizing and grounding about the festival," said Mike. "So many people in one place, excited to share knowledge and learn from each other; moving forward together, not towards faster phones or fancier cars, but toward these foundational, essential skills."

# Selkirk Bear Clan chapter seeks more foot patrol volunteers

In order to keep boots on the ground and a watchful eye over the city, the Selkirk Bear Clan chapter is seeking more volunteers interested in doing foot patrols.

Organizers behind the local Bear Clan chapter say they are currently going through a transitional period and have had to stop foot patrols until they can encourage more community members to volunteer. The Selkirk Bear Clan provides a community based approach to crime prevention, focusing on caring and helping their neighbours before they end up in the hands of the RCMP.

Marlena Muir, the chairperson of the

Selkirk Bear Clan's women's council, says the organization is needed in Selkirk.

"It's important to have some security, other than the RCMP. Someone with a more personal touch, who could deal with a situation compassionately," Muir said. "It's better to get help from your community members, instead of someone who isn't from here. They might not know how to react to certain situations."

Muir said Selkirk Bear Clan is inclusive, it's open to non-Indigenous people, and anyone who wants to help protect their community. The Selkirk Bear Clan also holds demonstrations around the area, providing comfort

and support for residents who have experienced a tragedy.

To help offset the lack of volunteers, the Selkirk Bear Clan started up a mobile patrol unit roughly five months ago.

Tara Campbell runs the mobile patrol mostly on her own. She uses her own vehicle, wears her vest and drives around Selkirk and area with some volunteers and some medical supplies in her car.


Campbell said the patrols are working, but as the number of drug-related crimes increase, the Selkirk Bear Clan needs more of a presence.

"I think it's bad, but not as bad as the (City of Winnipeg). I have caught

people scoping out cars and houses, when they see me drive around they take off," Campbell said. "It's working. We're here to make everyone feel safe, if they want us to patrol an area, they just have to message us."

Campbell said she's noticed a lot of attempted break-ins, most of which she's able to ward off just by patrolling.

## Fishing sometimes requires team work

Hi gang. Last week, if you read my column, you may remember I ended by wishing you had a great long weekend holiday. Shortly after I sent that column to my editors, I met a wonderful lady in the Interlake who along with her husband and friends, celebrated every May long weekend with a fishing trip.

To our good fortune, our new angling sister, Cindy Zink, shared a unique experience she had a few years ago. Cindy is the kind of gal you cannot help feeling at ease with. She spoke in a low, husky, melodious voice. This is her story.

One warm hazy day, she, her husband and another couple were boat fishing on the Lee River. Off to their starboard, maybe a half dozen boat lengths away, sat a tall, thin angler with his shorter, heavier buddy in a small aluminum boat much like theirs. They had been on the water for about a half hour when Cindy got a strike. She hauled up and reeled in until she had a nice two foot long walleye by the side of their little boat. She bent over the side, unhooked it and put it on her stringer. Just as she dropped the strung fish into the water, she saw a rippling wave moving toward her. She immediately realized from past experiences that a fairly large fish was swimming just under the water headed her way.

Rippling water peeled from the back of a huge jackfish as it jackknifed preparing to dive. Cindy shot a glance downward looking for her walleye but it was already under the boat. Looking up again, she had just enough time to see the jack that in her mind had to be four feet long, disappear after the walleye. Then came a rasping thud from under causing the thin metal of the little boat to shutter. Everyone instinctively clutched the sides of the craft as a vicious fight between the two fish erupted under the bottom of

surface as it made for the angler's baited hooks.

Soon the rod of the tall angler could be seen arching sharply down to the water as the giant jack took his hook. The rod quivered and bent as he braced himself to fight the huge fish. Across the distance between the two boats Cindy's group could hear their neighbors reel scream as he let the fish run. He could be seen sitting down and bracing his legs under the bench seat of the boat keeping tension in his line. He played the fish, letting it run when it wanted to, and then reeling in when it rested. In time he had it alongside his boat and with surprising strength bent over the side, grabbed the jack by the gills and rolling backward into the boat wound up with the fish flopping on top of him. The tall mans' buddy became so frightened when he saw the size of the fish he jumped over the windshield onto the bow deck and refused to get into the boat until his friend threw the monster back overboard!

Not long ago I was talking to a fellow angler, Brett Taplin, of Selkirk who caught a turtle. Fortunately it slipped the hook but it got me thinking. Here, in the summer, one can easily catch a turtle yet few know how to get the hook out, so here are a few tips. If you snag a turtle on its leg, get a short stick and put in front of its mouth. It will clamp on it like a dog then you can get the hook out. If a turtle gets hooked in the mouth, hold it by the shell with its face away from you. Keep tension on your line so it doesn't pull its head in and then grab it by the neck holding it out while a helper gets the hook out. If all else fails, take it to a vet.

While in Selkirk I stopped at the waterfront and met Ricardo Perez who was just landing this nice bass. Good job Ric! Well, that's it for this week my friends, bye for now.

the boat. The two couples could hear the slapping of tails, the slamming of fish bodies and the raking of Cindy's fish stringer grating against the boats aluminum side.

Cindy however was not a girl to mess with! She grabbed her stringer and hauled up hard, springing her walleye into the air. She dropped her fish on the floor of the boat then picked up an oar and began slapping the side of the boat to scare the jack. It worked! The top of its huge green head and long, slinky body swayed from under the boat then began swimming toward the neighboring angler's craft. Silence fell over Cindy and her people as they watched the jack flip its tail above the

## KAP identifies ag priorities ahead of provincial election

Keystone Agricultural Producers (KAP), the voice of farmers in Manitoba, says it will be advocating for the major issues that face the agriculture industry during the upcoming provincial election campaign.

According to the province, the agriculture sector represents more than \$6 billion to the Manitoba economy and creates over 35,000 jobs across the province.

"The investment that the agriculture sector makes in the Manitoba economy starts with the investment farmers make on their land, and the next provincial government needs to recognize that income on these investments is getting smaller," said KAP president Bill Campbell. "The next provincial government needs to come to the table with a real plan for the agriculture sector so that providing a cost-effective food source remains a financial success for Manitoba farmers."

During the provincial campaign, KAP intends to advocate on behalf of farmers on three major policy issues: equitable education funding for Manitoba's children, effective climate change programming, and enhanced infrastructure spending. A survey focused on these three key issues will be delivered to the four major parties and responses will be shared with both KAP members and the general public.

The name Red Feather Farm was derived from large chicken barns on the site, part of a farm operated by W. L. Parrish, and the battalion used a rooster as a symbol on its military badge.

## Cook re-elected as Interlake director at AMM district meeting

Selkirk played host to the June 18 Association of Manitoba Municipalities (AMM) District Meeting where two city resolutions were passed and City Coun. Kelly Cook was re-elected district director for the Interlake region.

Selkirk Mayor Larry Johannson, who is the chair of AMM's Cities Caucus, said resolutions passed at the district level move on to the annual convention in November and have the ability to impact change across the province. From now until the convention, the resolution will be circulated to other municipalities to gain support.

Selkirk's first resolution seeks to have the Municipal Act changed to allow more flexibility in the setting

of prices, which currently has to be done through a by-law, and the second resolution calls upon the AMM to lobby the provincial government to index the provincial support grant at the rate of Consumer Price Index or higher. The grant – which provides municipalities with financial support for various programs – has been frozen for the past three years.

The 90-plus representatives at the meeting were given wildflower seeds from Prairie Originals as a gift and a donation was made to the Selkirk Parks Endowment Fund in all their names.

Attendees were given a tour of the Selkirk Rec-

reation Complex, which was in the midst of being decorated for the graduation ceremonies. Of particular interest to attendees was the new solar generation capacity of the centre.

Coun. Kelly Cook was re-elected as Interlake District Director, a position he has held since being elected last November in a byelection. Directors serve two-year terms.

Cook said he's looking forward to his term, having gained some valuable experience during the last six months.

"We kind of cue each other," Corbin said.

Two Crows for Comfort will also play

off-stage at the Winnipeg Folk Festival.

The duo is returning this year as part of the festival's minstrel program, where artists play unplugged in areas that festivalgoers don't normally hear music. This way, people will always have music around, even when they aren't near the main stages.

Corbin enjoys the program because the festival listeners are all music-lovers.

Corbin sings and plays the tambou-

rine while Sulyma plays the guitar, the harmonica and the drum – at the same time.

Two Crows for Comfort have been playing together for the past two years, which Corbin said began for fun.

The two performed casually – at coffee houses, on open mic nights.

"Then, we started getting asked to do more," Corbin said.

As the pair gained popularity, they decided they needed a name. Sulyma kept a notebook with his song ideas. While flipping through it, he found a line reading "two crows for comfort."

"We were like, 'Oh, this works, we're two,'" Corbin said.

The duo lives in Stonewall, but they've travelled beyond Manitoba's boundaries for music.

On Oct. 16, 2018, Two Crows for Comfort played in New York City at Rockwood Music Hall. The following month, they performed in Toronto for Indie Week Canada.

Corbin and Sulyma have taken their songs to Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia. They released their album 17 Feet in 2018.

The music duo is booked for several performances this summer, including Canada Day at the Forks, Altona's Manitoba Sunflower Festival and Teulon's I AM Festival.

Two Crows for Comfort will be on stage at Winnipeg Folk Festival from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, July 14. They'll perform on the Shady Grove stage.

One of the Village of Dunnottar's iconic poplar piers along the shoreline of Lake Winnipeg will be featured in an upcoming multimillion-dollar Amazon TV series.

Tugela Park and Tugela Pier was to be closed from Tuesday, July 9 to Friday, July 12 as film crews will be doing some filming for the science fiction TV series, "Tales from the loop."

Council granted permission to the film production crew to use the area.

Gimli Road, from 135 Gimli Road to 145 Gimli Road, will also have intermittent closures on Thursday, July 11 to allow for filming.

"These road closures are expected to be for short durations but frequent," a release from the Village of Dunnottar stated last week. "We are asking all residents to avoid this area during the specified dates to ensure the crew can

complete their project in a timely and efficient manner.

"The flowing well will remain open during this time."

Village of Dunnottar Mayor Rick Gamble said their pier crew met with the production team and they brought a structural engineer out to ensure the pier was safe for their film crew and all their gear.

"We're happy that they're doing it here and that they're doing it in a way that should inconvenience our residents as least as possible," Gamble said.

Gamble added this isn't the first time one of the piers is being used for filming.

"We're looking forward to it. They've been really good with us."

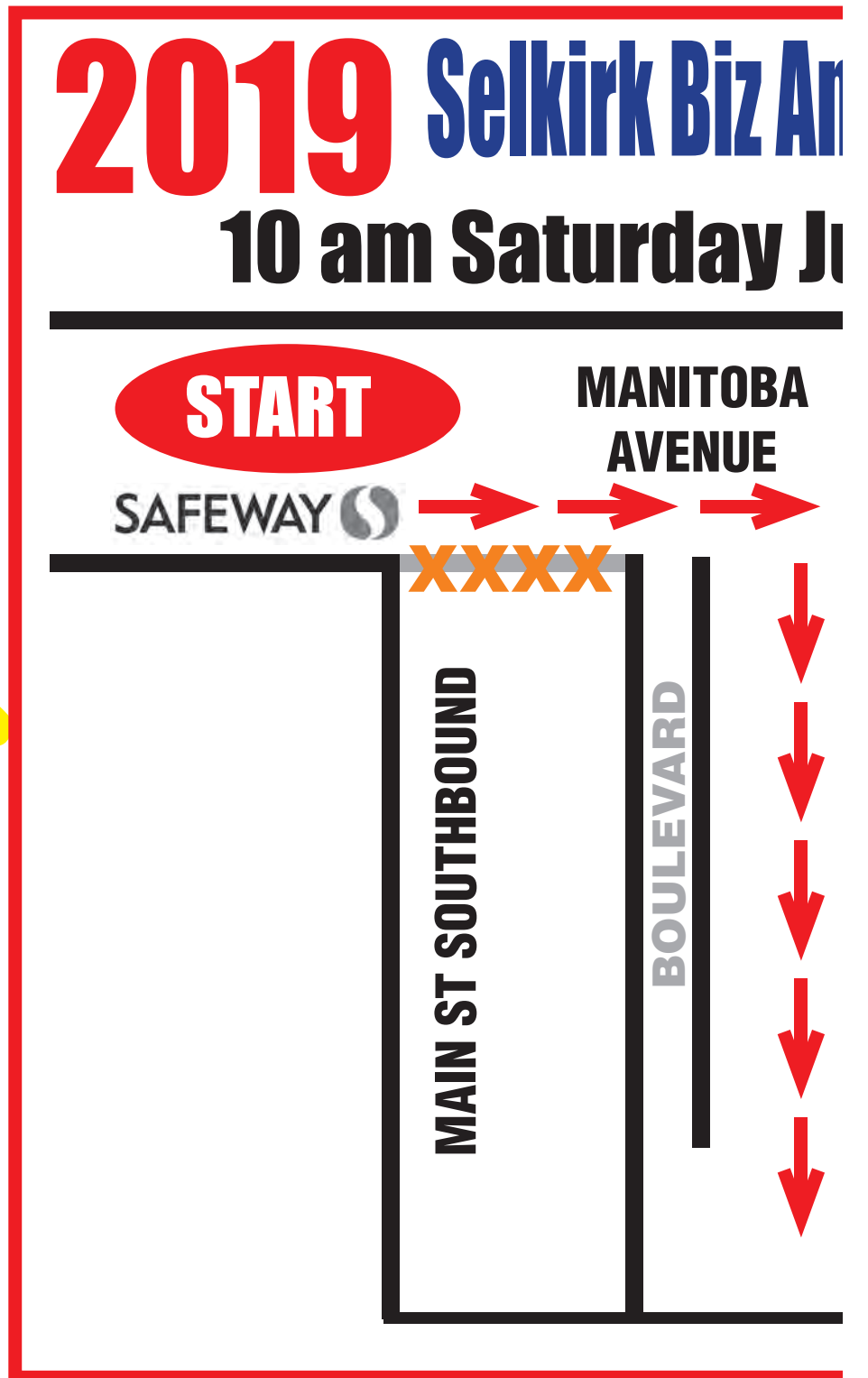

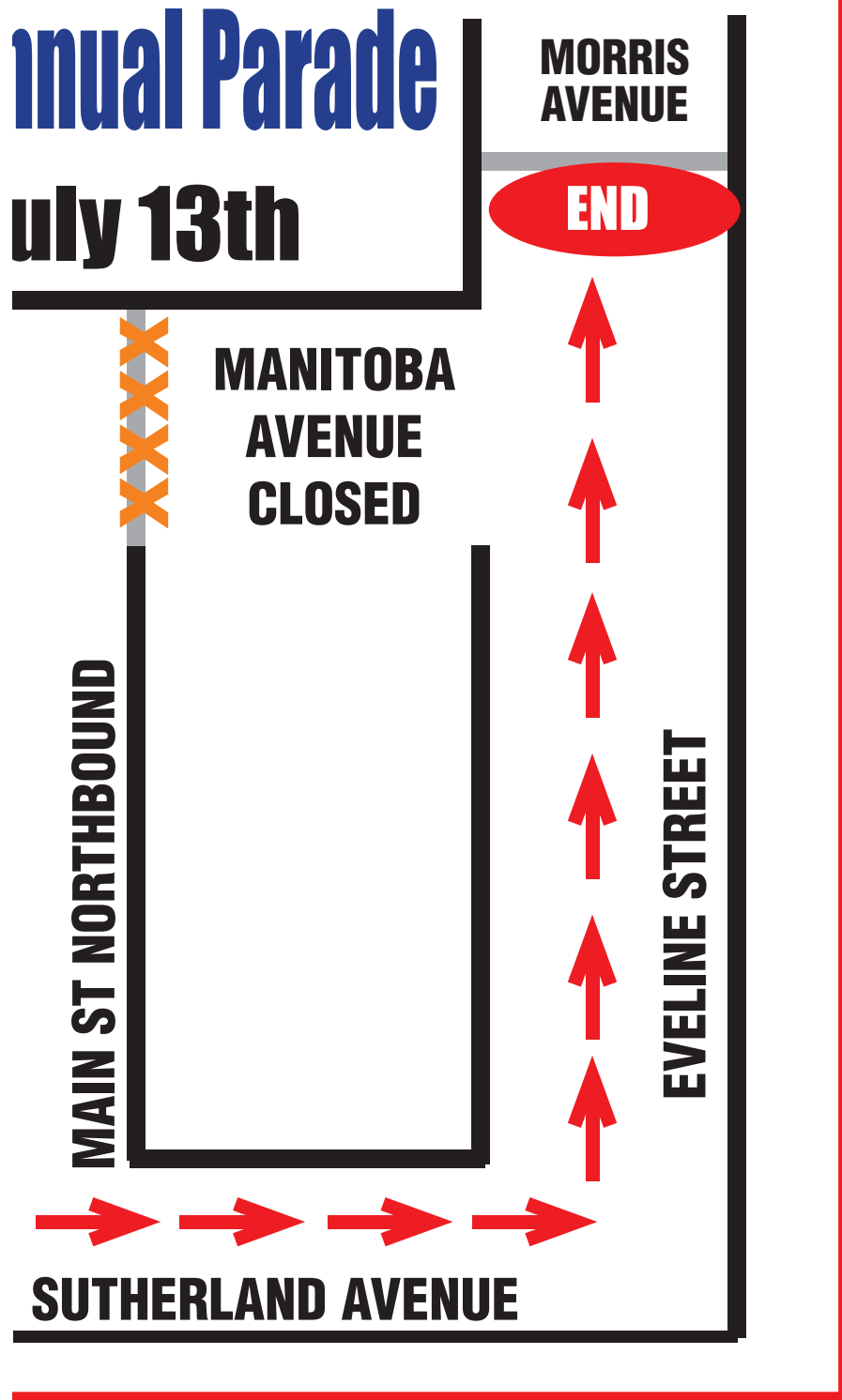

**Crispy Baked Wings with Chipotle Barbecue Sauce or Nashville-Style Sauce**

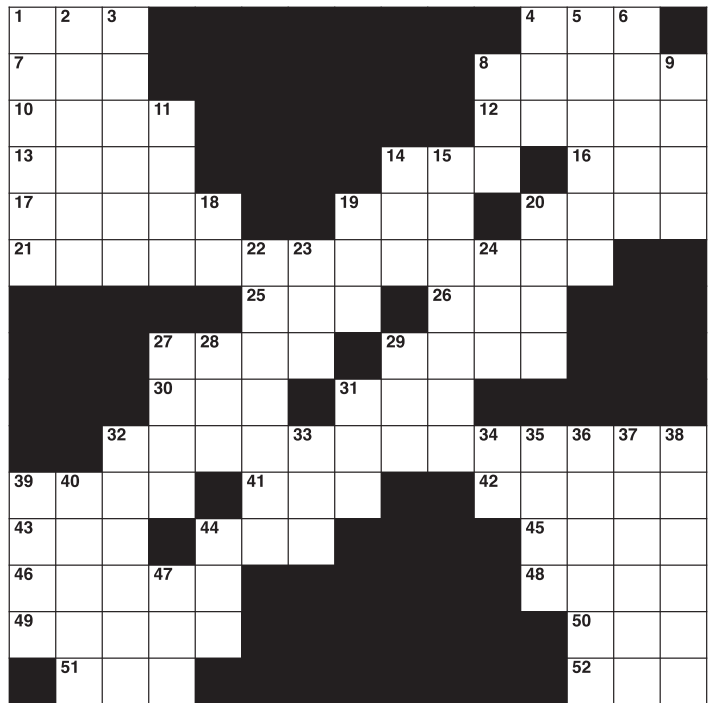
Prep time: 10 minutes  
Cook time: 40 minutes  
Servings: 4-6

Wings:  
2 tablespoons baking powder  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon paprika  
1/4 teaspoon black pepper  
4 1/2 pounds chicken wings, drums and flats separated, tips removed  
Chipotle Barbecue Sauce:  
1 cup barbecue sauce  
3 tablespoons Tabasco Chipotle Sauce  
2 tablespoons lime juice  
Nashville-Style Sauce:  
6 tablespoons Tabasco Sauce  
8 tablespoons butter, softened  
1 tablespoon light brown sugar  
1 teaspoon paprika  
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt

Heat oven to 425 F.  
In bowl, combine baking powder, salt, paprika and black pepper. Shake over both sides of wings. Place seasoned wings on rack over foil-lined sheet pan. Bake 20 minutes, turn wings over and continue cooking additional 20 minutes in convection oven or 30 minutes in conventional oven. Cooked wings should reach at least 180 F internal temperature with crispy texture.  
To make Chipotle Barbecue Sauce: In bowl, mix barbecue sauce, Tabasco Chipotle Sauce and lime juice. Alternatively, to make Nashville-Style Wing Sauce: In bowl, mix Tabasco Sauce, butter, brown sugar, paprika, garlic powder and salt. Set aside.  
Remove wings from oven. Toss wings with preferred sauce and serve.

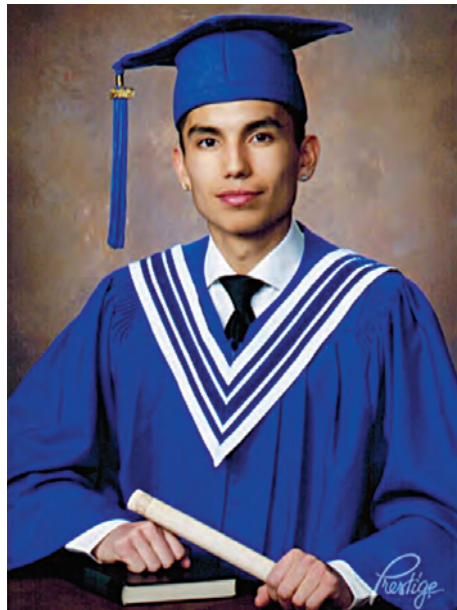

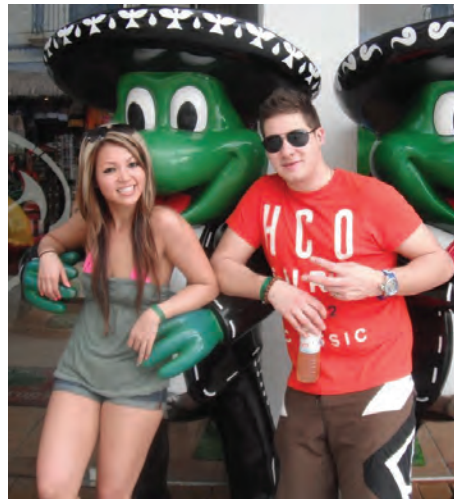
