Operation Red Nose volunteers help keep drivers in check

If you're heading to a Christmas celebration in the Selkirk area, Operation Red Nose volunteers want to help make sure you get home safe.

So far this season, 15 volunteers have been braving the snow and sleep deprivation to make sure community members get home safely from their holiday parties.

The Selkirk Record spent some time with volunteers last Friday evening to learn more about the operation and how it helps keep impaired drivers off the road.

On average, Operation Red Nose receives around 18 calls per night. By 1 a.m. last Saturday, they had received 15 calls, and according to the organizers, they are expecting to exceed that average over the next few weekends.

Jeff Mclean has been volunteering with Operation Red Nose for two years. This year he brought along his wife, Stacey, to serve as the escort driver for his team. He said that Operation Red Nose in Selkirk is very community focused and that's why it's starting to gain traction.

"I believe that everyone in the Selkirk area is connected," Mclean said. "Everyone has some connection to

the Selkirk Dolphins, this benefits the community and I think everyone is starting to realize that ... (Operation Red Nose) is very important for smaller communities like us, because I find that people think they're just going down the street, so there's a higher chance of people driving while impaired."

Manitoba RCMP launched their Holiday Checkstop program on Dec. 1, and within their first weekend, officers charged 21 people with impaired driving and issued six alcohol related suspensions.

According to RCMP, 46 people lost their lives due to impaired driving last year. So far this year, 76 people have been killed and 166 seriously injured in collisions on Manitoba roadways. RCMP added 30 per cent of those crashes involved impaired drivers.

Dermot McDonald, who is also a Operation Red Nose volunteer, said he believes more people in Selkirk are starting to understand the dangers of drunk driving.

"One of my favourite stories is there was a big house party, and they said 'Oh, we never use Operation Red Nose, but someone made us.' So we start taking them home and on the way there, we passed by a checkstop. They were bewildered, saying 'Oh my God I would have been caught," McDonald said. "There's three guys who won't be driving drunk ever again. You just got to educate people."

Trailer park tenants face uncertain future despite extension

Christmas has come early in the form of an extension to an eviction date set for Selkirk Trailer Park residents.

Val Goertzen, who has called the local trailer park home for more than a year, said she received a letter in the mail last week notifying her that tenants have been granted an extension to the original Dec. 31 deadline to move their trailers.

"It was awesome," the 64-year-old who lives along Dominique Drive South said in regards to the letter she received last week. "It was like Merry Christmas to me and that's what I told them too on the phone.

"This really made my day."

The letter, which was dated Dec. 12 and issued to all tenants, states that the owners of a numbered Manitoba company "have decided to honor all extensions to those who have request-

ed one."

"We are also willing to extend your request further if needed to December 31, 2018," the letter from CanWest Developments and Property Management based in Winnipeg reads. "Please let us know if you need a further extension."

But the news of an extension has come a little too late for those who have already moved into an apartment or moved their trailers to a new location. Goertzen said she knows of at least five people who have already

packed up and moved.

She added she's not sure why they have been granted this extension.

"It doesn't say but I figure something's going wrong why they're not moving in here right away."

Earlier this year the *Record* reported that Selkirk Trailer Park residents received an eviction notice from a numbered company that owns the land indicating that all tenants and their

trailers had to be moved by Dec. 31.

In that letter to residents, the trailer park owners stated that over the years several maintenance issues have come up, "which have caused severe financial loses," and they can no longer operate the park under these conditions.

"The sewer line has broken in a few locations and repairing will not solve the problem," the letter stated. "To replace the sewer lines, trailers would have to be moved from each lot and cost is not even financially feasible."

During a Red River Planning District Board (RRPDB) meeting in July to rezone the land, a spokesman said the owners of the park are no longer willing to make further investments into repairs.

The developers also indicated on a

site plan that they plan to build a variety of housing options, which may include single family lots, duplexes, row housing and a condominium apartment building.

A spokesman said their plan is to build affordable housing on the land in four phases, with the final phase being where the trailer park currently sits. He added their plan would take roughly 10 to 15 years to fully develop.

In July, the RRPDB was also told that the trailer park was home to 47 trailers, two of which are vacant.

Goertzen said she is still trying to sell her trailer or is willing to find a place to relocate it.

"I'd love to keep it but I have no place to take it," she said. "I'm just taking this day by day."

Mclean and McDonald drove around the Interlake, talking and joking with their passengers, while they brought them and their car home safely last Saturday night. At one point in the night, the team drove a couple almost to Libau. One of the passengers, Cole Urbanovitch, a 20-year-old East Selkirk resident, said he was glad Operation Red Nose helped him and his girlfriend get home safe.

"People should be calling Operation Red Nose, it's the better, safer option," he said. "We got home safe, we didn't hurt anybody. That's what we did tonight, and that's what everybody should be doing ... your car comes home with you, and it just all works out."

According to some of the other Operation Red Nose volunteers, they've "never had a bad response. Everyone is just happy to see us."

Operation Red Nose launched late last month in Selkirk and will run on Dec. 22 and 31 from 9 p.m. till 3 a.m.

To book a ride, call 204-482-6673. The service operates in Selkirk, East St.

Paul, St. Andrews, and most of the Interlake region.

Julie McPherson, the local Operation Red Nose co-ordinator, said that they are still looking for more volunteers, especially for New Year's Eve. For more information, contact McPherson via email at juliehowell@live.ca or by calling 204-782-6924. Volunteers must have a valid driver's license, and be able to pass a criminal record check.

When a person calls for a ride home, Operation Red Nose sends three people: A driver, a navigator, and an es-

The driver and the navigator help get the passenger and their car home safely, while the escort vehicle follows them and picks up the driver and the navigator after they are done.

Although the service is free, some choose to make a donation, which goes directly to the Selkirk Dolphins Swim Club. Funds raised go towards keeping the team's fees down as well as covering coaching, equipment and pool costs.





City seeks proposals for land on Pittsburg Ave.

The City of Selkirk has put out a call for proposals regarding a 2.09 acre commercially zoned and fully serviced piece of land located at 400 Pittsburg Ave.

For example, years ago they were fishing off "the point" at Nutimik Lake and a wind took their umbrella which quickly sank as the gust left it. Years later at the same place Chris snagged it and was surprised to learn it still worked. Again that summer they were shore fishing at the point and a fox kept coming around running in between their feet. They tried everything to shoo him away and finally John tossed his shoe at it whereupon the fox decided to leave taking Johns' shoe with him. They never saw the fox or the shoe again!

Last Tuesday I was just pulling up to the north "monkey trials" on the Red when I saw two anglers pulling their loaded sleigh on land. These lifelong buddies, Rick Carriere and Lindsay Zaborniuk had come in from Winnipeg, I learned and as we talked Rick remembered last winter when they were fishing here in their ice shack he snagged a giant catfish in the tail section. They had a terrible time bringing it up through the ten inch hole and to make matters worse the cat must have been lying in the mud so as soon as they had it up it began spraying wet cold mud all over. Both men got down on their hands and knees slipping and sliding in the stinky mud trying to get the hook out of the trashing beast. Finally they got it out and sent the fish back down the hole while


























Family helps spread Christmas cheer at Selkirk hospital



Tip: Puree can be made in advance, covered and refrigerated up to 2
