## **Services to Seniors thanks community** for Gift of Warmth donations

Warm gifts let patients know community cares

Services to Seniors would like to thank the members of the community who made donations to the Gift of Warmth program that they participated in this year.

The program, which is in its first year and a collaborative effort between Services to Seniors, the Interlake-Eastern Health Foundation and the dialysis units, gives patients at the Interlake-Eastern Regional Health Authority(IERHA) renal unit at Selkirk General Hospital, as well as Gimli Hospital, gifts of items to keep them toasty and comfortable.

Services to Seniors were connected to the program when IERHA staff members asked if they knew someone who might be willing to put on a Santa suit and spread some cheer at the hospital's renal unit.

"We said, oh yeah, for sure. We can try to reach out and see what we can do," said Colleen Larocque, Resource Coordinator at Services to Seniors.

As they had a person who had done the job before, securing a jolly helper

wasn't hard. They also decided that it would add to the fun if they also had some small gifts for each of the dialysis patients.

"I thought, Oh my gosh, we're a nonprofit; what are we going to do here. We first reached out to our local Gordon Howard here and asked them if they had any extra knitting. Right away, they had us meet with their knitting group there, and we expressed to them what we were doing. And right away they were like, let us see what we can do," said Larocque.

Next, they decided to put out the

call on their Facebook page, and like the Gordon Howard Centre members, community members were quick to

"The pouring in of support was just insane. The donations were just amazing. We had people from everywhere coming in with bags of stuff. There were crocheted hats and mitts and scarves, brand new wrapped blankets. It's been very overwhelming. It's great to see," said Larocque.

With all of the support they received, they quickly had enough donations for all 45 patients, and the items were wrapped and ready to be given out. They even had a little extra that they

plan to give to some people that they know are in need, and, if they have any left over, people visiting the soup kitchen. They have made a commitment that all of the items will be given to someone who needs the warmth this winter.

Jayme Anderson, Community Resource Coordinator at Services to Seniors, explained that this was a natural extension of what they do at Services to Seniors.

"Helping people in need is the basis of our services to seniors. As soon as they(the IERHA staff) walked in, me and Colleen were just overjoyed to do something different. And we both love Christmas, so it was just adding what we normally do, and then

adding a little Christmas touch to it," said Anderson.

Because dialysis is a process that requires people to come back to the hospital verv regularly for treatments, tients can end up spending quite a bit of time away from home, and something to keep warm in winter is never a bad gift in the Interlake.

The gifts were given out last week, and Anderson and Larocque were looking forward to it.

They also hope that the people who donated might have learned a little bit about Services to Seniors in the process, and if they or a friend or family member ever need a helping hand, they know that Services to Seniors is a resource in our community.

Some of the programs that they offer are a driver escort program for medical rides, a shopping assist program and Meals on Wheels. But they can also help with the little bumps that we all have to figure out.

"If people get mail and they're not understanding different things that

they're receiving when it comes to, like the government or what grants and different things are out there, we always try to keep up to date on everything. We're always willing to help people fill out applications or grant applications, or even just come over and have a cup of coffee," said Anderson.

## Wishing you a safe and Happy Holiday Season

Make sure that you keep the season holly and jolly with these safety tips

Everyone wants to focus on having a great time with friends and family this time of year. The easiest way to do that is to plan ahead with these festive safety tips.

#### For your Vehicle

- Don't let your vehicle run with the keys in.
- Don't leave purchases, valuables, or presents visible in vehicles. Store them in your trunk or somewhere out of sight.
- Park in well-lit spots.
- Keep your vehicle door locked

- For a safe journey, make sure you've prepared your vehicle with winter tires and filling up on washer fluid, etc. You should also check that your battery is looking good and your tire pressure is in range.
- Check weather conditions for both where you are and your destination before hitting the
- Keep a cold-weather survival kit in your vehicle. Include a candle and matches, water, non-perishable food, a first aid kit, flares or reflectors, booster cables and

- a shovel, an ice scraper, warm clothes, boots and blankets.
- Don't drive if conditions are bad, but if you absolutely need to get where you're going, slow down and get there fashionably late.
- Before you drive, clear snow and ice from your vehicle and be sure you can see through your windshield, windows and mirrors. Make sure your light
- covers are clear, and remember to clear snow off the hood and roof to prevent snow from flying onto vehicles behind you.
- Don't plug your vehicle in if it's in a garage, as faulty block heaters and extension cords could be a fire hazard, and garages tend to stay warm enough to not need to plug your vehicle in.

#### For your Home

- Keep your doors locked even when you are home. This counts for garages and any other buildings as well.
- Keep your house and yard welllit at night.
- Make sure your address is visible from the street.
- Remember that thieves can see inside your house if the inside light is brighter than the outside, so consider using curtains or blinds for your privacy.
- Schedule package deliveries for when you are home or coordinate with a neighbour who can receive deliveries for you.

#### In your Home

- Be careful not to overload outlets.
- Extension cords are meant to be a temporary measure. Use them as they are intended to be used (outdoors for outdoors and indoors for indoors), and make sure not to hide them under rugs or other materials, as this can cause them to overheat and cause a fire hazard.
- Be safe with candles by placing them on stable, heat-resistant surfaces and never leaving them unattended. Alternatively, you can also consider using flameless, battery-operated candles for a safer alternative.
- Keep decorations and trees away from heat sources like electric

- heaters, candles or fireplaces.
- Inspect your decorations for frayed cords or broken bulbs before use.
- Always turn off holiday lights before going to bed or leaving your home.
- With the increased use of furnaces in the winter, make sure you have working carbon monoxide detectors on each level of your residence and test your de-
- tectors regularly.
- Don't leave electric heaters unattended, and make sure they have adequate airflow and are on a level surface.

- Purchase toys with the child's age in mind. Toys can contain components such as button batteries or magnets that can be swallowed by young children and cause serious injury or death. Consider toys that have battery compartments which require screws rather than slideto-open levers.
- Make sure that gifts for older kids and adults are tucked away when their younger family members are around, as they might also contain small pieces that can cause injury to small children.
- Throw out or recycle all toy packaging like plastic bags, plastic wrap, foam, staples, ties and protective film right away so that these potentially dangerous items are out of harm's way.

#### **Pet safety**

- Keep small decorations, tinsel or any wayward wires out of reach.
- Certain holiday plants like poinsettias, holly, pine needles, ivy garland, lilies and mistletoe can be toxic if ingested by animals.
- If using a real tree, make sure that pets are kept out of the water reservoir, as some water additives for real trees can be toxic.
- Additionally, if you have a curious climbing pet, make sure to secure your tree to a wall so that the pet and décor don't take a tumble.
- Make sure pets only have access to and open presents while supervised and that they don't ingest any paper or tape.
- Common holiday foods such as chocolate, turkey skin and bones, ham, grapes and raisins, garlic, caffeine, alcohol, onions, certain spices and sweets, especially any containing xylitol, should be avoided. For festive pet-safe foods, there are a vari-

ety of sweet and savoury dog treats just for the holidays. If you think your pet has accidentally ingested a toxic food or other material, contact your veterinarian immediately.

#### If you're out of town

- Tell a neighbour you trust when you are gone and when you will be back so that they can keep an eve out for any changes.
- You can use timers to activate lights and radios, making your home appear to be occupied.
- Avoid letting people know about your travel plans on social media.
- Arrange for daily pickup of mail if it comes to your home so that it doesn't pile up.
- Lower the volume of your telephone ringer to avoid drawing attention to unanswered calls.
- Secure all entry points, including garages, sheds, and gates and consider disconnecting garage door openers.
- Request your trusted neighbours park in your driveway occasionally and place out garbage cans on collection days.

#### **Avoid Scammers**

Fraudsters, unfortunately, don't take the holidays off. Make sure to be extra aware that you aren't giving out any personal information over the phone, even if it's to a trusted family member, without verifying the source of the call is authentic.

## Lockport Ice Fishing Village returning again this year

Just waiting for ice conditions to be right to get set up going

It's looking like this holiday season is going to cool down enough that the Lockport Ice Fishing Village is going to be able to make its return again. "It's free events that we put on where we clear roads and set up games and a skating rink. It really just brings the community together," explained Erik Stone, Co-owner of Red River Cats.

Stone said that it's a bit early to be able to say exactly what day the ice fishing village will be officially open, but if all goes well and we get cool enough temperatures for long enough, he thinks that the village could be open around the beginning of January. This is all contingent on the ice thickness level.

Red River Cats coordinates the set up of the Lockport Ice Fishing Village, but if any businesses or community members want to help make the magic happen, there are still opportunities to help out.

"Anybody who'd be willing to donate any time or money would be phenomenal. They can just give us a call. We do have an honorarium system, and we are looking for a bunch of volunteers to help set up the village. Because it's completely a volunteer (effort)," said Stone.

As in previous years, there will be roads and bays for people to set up for fishing, but for non-fishers or just people wanting to have some fun on the ice, there are a few other activities.

"We will make up our skating rink. We do a croco-curl, which is like crokinole, but with curling rocks. And then, we're going to do a slingshot alley again this year, which was tons of fun," said Stone.

For those not versed in slingshot alley, it involves a couple of bands attached to a harness, and the lucky person is propelled forward on a sled or toboggan because of the elastic

Also, another fun part of the ice fishing village that will be coming back again is that the local Domino's has agreed to deliver pizzas on the ice again this year. Just call them up and let them know what street in the ice fishing village you are on, and they can deliver it right to your shack.

## William Kennedy has been declared a person of national significance

## Boost in recognition for a person who did much work in our community

Local history buffs and pretty much anyone who's taken a tour of the St. Andrews Heritage Centre know that Captain William Kennedy was a significant person in the shaping of our local area during his lifetime. Wanting to acknowledge him as an important historical figure both to Manitoba and Canada, the St. Andrews Municipal Heritage Advisory Committee submitted his name for consideration, and they were successful in having Kennedy recognized by Parks Canada as a person of national historic significance.

Captain William Kennedy was born in 1814 and lived in St. Andrews from 1862 until his death in 1890.

Rob Sarginson and Paul Kushnar, members of the St. Andrews Municipal Heritage Advisory Committee, credit Gayle DeGagne for discovering that Kennedy could be nominated and bringing it to the group. "(Kennedy) was an Arctic explorer. He was very much involved in the (history) of Manitoba, and he was one of the early promoters of attaching the Red River Colony to Canada back in the 1840s and 50s. He even tried to establish a postal link between Toronto and the Red River, which, at the time, there were no roads, no telegraph, no railways, nothing. He did it on snowshoes and dog sled," said Sarginson. The Manitoba Historical Society's

The Manitoba Historical Society's online Archives says that he made the trip starting from Toronto on the 22nd of January and arrived at the Red River Settlement on the 27th of February, 1857.

In addition to Kennedy's local victories, he also led an expedition into the North in search of the Franklin expedition

The Franklin expedition, consisting of the HMS Erebus and HMS Terror, was a famously lost Arctic exploration led by John Franklin that departed England in 1845. It was attempting to traverse the Northwest Passage. It went missing, and its location was a mystery for well over 100 years.

Kennedy didn't find the expedition, one ship was located in 2014 and the other in 2016 by Parks Canada, but he did accomplish a lot, mapping a large area and bringing his entire crew back alive.

Some of his other work was lobbying against the Hudson's Bay Company's monopoly over the area that would eventually become Manitoba.

Sarginson, a retired teacher, explained that he thought it was very important that Kennedy receive this recognition, as it allows local kids to learn about someone in history class that they can relate to.

"There is a shortage of Westerners, a shortage of Indigenous people, a shortage of Métis people, a shortage of Inuit people. There's just a lack of representation in all these areas (in our history books). And yet, without the Inuit, a lot of our explorers would have perished in the Arctic, including Kennedy. Without representation, kids can't see themselves," he said.

Kennedy was an Indigenous person with a Cree mother and Scottish father.

The process of having him acknowledged took several years.

"It was 2019, and I did get a letter from the Heritage Sites and Monuments Board in 2019 saying that he was approved as a candidate to be considered," said Gayle DeGagne, a member of the St. Andrews Municipal Heritage Advisory Committee.

She explained that the Heritage Sites and Monuments Board didn't ask the committee for much information because they wanted to do their own research into Kennedy's achievements.

"It was just very general, standard information that we gave them. It wasn't that complicated a process," she said.


She believes that the Heritage Sites and Monuments Board considered his many local and national accomplishments in giving Kennedy this recognition.

"He was also a jack of all trades in some ways, because he was an explorer. He brought the first Postal Service to St Andrews. And, he was involved in all of the small ventures around the community as well," she said.

The group learned that Kennedy had been recognized in 2023, and the official announcement was made by the federal government recently.

"I was very glad that we were suc-

## Winnipeg Livestock sees strongest cattle market in years

Shrinking herds, strong demand push prices to new highs

Winnipeg Livestock Sales Ltd. is reporting one of the strongest cattle markets in recent memory, fuelled by shrinking herd numbers and growing global demand for North American

Field representative Scott Anderson said the auction yard continues to see steady volumes move through the ring, even as prices surge.

"In the past year, we've seen cattle prices double from previous all-time highs," he said. "That is why things are so expensive in all areas of the market. The supply isn't there while the demand is — and the cost of beef is going to the moon."

He said the strength stretches beyond Canada's borders with foreign buyers increasingly active in the mar-

"North America is exporting more beef than ever as foreign buyers are choosing North American products," Anderson said. "It's encouraging to see the market stay this strong even though there seem to be fewer cattle available each year."

Lower feed costs have also helped

support pricing, Anderson added. Weather has not had a significant effect this year, allowing markets to remain relatively stable.

One moment uncertainty came when U.S. president Donald Trump suggested beef prices should drop for consumers — commentary that briefly shook cattle markets.

"Some comments suggested beef should be cheaper for consumers, but that comes at the expense of the producers," Anderson said. "If retail prices go down, cattle prices have to go down too. That created a general sense of negativity in the markets."


The situation has since settled after signs the U.S. government intends to support beef producers.

"At the end of the day, the question we're always asking is, what is a market-ready fat steer going to be worth? Producers work back from there," he

Winnipeg Livestock Sales hosts cattle auctions every Friday and goat and sheep sales on the first and third Wednesday of each month. The business also acts as an agent for The Electronic Auction Market (TEAM), which runs virtual sales on Fridays.

Those online platforms have widened access for buyers and sellers, Anderson said. Brokers often repre-

sent dozens of producers, bringing competition into the ring from well beyond Manitoba.


"It's buyer beware. Good cattle bring higher prices with the beauty being in the eye of the beholder," he said. "Our job is to sort and show the cattle well so buyers know what to expect."

He said auction markets also provide financial security producers don't always receive in private sales.

"When livestock sells here, producers can pick up their cheque that day. There's no worry about being scammed by a buyer," he said. "Through a licensed and bonded market, you know you'll be looked after."

Heading into 2026, Anderson expects strength to continue and encourages producers to keep cattle in top condition if they want to capture the top end of the market.

"With prices at all-time highs, there are big discounts on animals that come into the ring looking tired or unwell," he said. "Cattle that look bouncy and shiny always bring a premium. Keep them vaccinated, fed and cared for you never want them sick or dead before they reach the market."

Dear Money Lady, I know it's not tax season, but have you got any tips on how to reduce the amount of taxes I pay every year?

Dear Carol,

Unfortunately, the more money you make the more tax you pay, thanks to the marginal tax rate system in Canada. Many people make financial decisions based on their gross income; however, from a planning perspective, it's not good enough to know how much money you make, but rather to know how much money you keep. Making a dollar today doesn't mean you can count on spending that dollar to-

We all have two layers of taxation in Canada: federal and provincial. The one thing that is guaranteed with taxation, is that it is progressive. So, over time it continues to go up. Just to give you an example: when RRSPs first came out in 1957, the highest marginal tax rate in Ontario was 11.5 per cent, now it is 53.5 per cent. Knowing your marginal tax rate is one part of understanding your net income; however, there are specific strategies that you can utilize to help minimize the taxes you pay. The three best ways are to Deduct, Defer and Divide. Let's talk about each method.

1. Deduct: This would be a deduction or claim to reduce your taxable income. The best way to do this is to have a home-based business, be an independent contractor, or be a selfemployed entrepreneur to write off expenses against your gross taxable income. Look for ways to lower your income through various expenses or income-splitting.

2. Defer: Deferring tax means you move the obligation to pay current taxes into your future years. The advantages to deferring taxation works on the premise that it is better to pay the taxation in the future; perhaps when your income is much lower, than to pay it today, when your income is in a higher marginal tax



bracket. This can be done through registered pension plans (RPP + PRPP), registered retirement savings plans (RRSP + RRIF), registered education savings plans (RESP), and registered disability savings plans (RDSP).

3. Divide: Income splitting is the best way to divide your income and lower taxation. Now I know that many of you who are single will say that this is not relevant – and you're right. Dividing income can only be done with your partner (so you will need to have one to do this last taxation step). Here are some of the ways you can split income.

\* Spousal RRSPs

\* Sharing CPP benefits

\* Paying wages to family members through a business

\* Using trusts

\* Using partnerships or corporations to earn business income

Tax planning is easier than you think. Try to utilize a TFSA (tax free savings account) as much as possible. If you were 18 or older as of January 1, 2009 when TFSAs first started you can contribute up to \$102,000 in the cumulated contribution room since inception.

## GrainFox provides 2026 market outlook and releases Al assistant

GrainFox delivered its annual grain market outlook and announced a new artificial intelligence tool during its Bin to Bank webinar on Nov. 19.

GrainFox chief market analyst Neil Townsend and AgResource Company founder and president Dan Basse outlined the top 10 variables expected to influence grain markets in the year ahead, citing global supply and demand, geopolitics, weather volatility and trade relations as key drivers.

GrainFox's Variable Countdown

10 – Breakout candidates (barley, oats and durum):

Townsend said tightening global supply and increased offshore market activity are creating renewed interest in several crops. Canada's durum crop was described as "representative," making transactions easier, while oats emerged as the strongest breakout candidate due to U.S. market dynamics and trade relationships.

"If I had to pick one of the three in terms of having a bit of an uprise from here, it would be oats," Townsend said.

9 – Black Sea war and export potential:

Basse said worsening conditions in the region continue to threaten export infrastructure, raising concerns similar to those seen in 2021. While wheat remains oversupplied, he expects global availability to gradually decline into next year if disruptions persist.

8 – India's pulse supply:

Townsend said India's domestic supply situation does not currently support higher prices, which could result in stricter import policies. He noted this poses challenges for Canada, adding he does not see conditions that would create a major upswing in pulse prices.

7 – South American weather:

Basse said favourable weather is currently supporting corn and soybean planting, particularly in Brazil. If conditions hold into early January, Brazil could plant a 180-million-tonne soybean crop, though weather risks remain a constant concern.

#### 6 – Macroeconomics:

Townsend said inflation pressures following the pandemic have created affordability challenges, though agriculture has performed relatively well compared to other sectors. He cautioned, however, that economic uncertainty continues, with recession fears frequently resurfacing.

5 – U.S. exports and balance sheets: Basse said U.S. farmers produced a corn crop comparable in size to the combined corn and soybean output

of Brazil, Argentina, Uruguay and Paraguay. He expects export demand to remain strong, with end stocks for corn, soybeans and wheat remaining ample.

4 – Demand:

Townsend said demand for Canadian wheat is solid but lacks the growth momentum seen in previous years, particularly with limited expansion in biofuel initiatives.

"It's not that demand's poor, it's just that it doesn't have that built-in dynamic growth that it had for many years," he said.

3 – U.S.–China relations:

Basse described the relationship as an ongoing economic conflict, particularly around soybeans, and said the global ag trade landscape is becoming increasingly fragmented as countries align with competing power centres.

2 – Canada–China relations:

Townsend said unresolved trade disputes, including restrictions on Canadian canola, continue to slow negotiations. He added that the lack of perceived equality between the two countries complicates efforts to restore full market access.

1 – Donald Trump:

Basse said U.S. president Donald Trump remains the biggest wildcard in global markets due to uncertainty around tariffs, trade policy and political influence.

"I have not been at an ag conference this year that didn't bring up President Trump as being the big unknown," he said.

GrainFox also announced the launch of Sinoa, an AI-powered grain market assistant it describes as a major Ag-Tech advancement heading into 2026.

"Sinoa is a major leap forward for AI-powered ag intelligence," said Mark Lepp, CEO and founder of GrainFox. "This isn't just a chatbot—it's an AI grain market analyst built for real-world decision-makers."

According to GrainFox, Sinoa draws from more than 20 years of proprietary data, including historical pricing, fundamentals and seasonality, to generate real-time, explainable insights tailored to individual users. Responses are built through live analysis rather than prewritten answers.

"Producers and commercial agribusinesses don't just get a market summary — they get a deeper, personalized understanding of what that information means for them," said Richard Surrendrakumar, GrainFox's chief product officer.

#### **DARK CHRISTMAS CAKE**

(add 2 lbs. currants if desired)

1 lb. butter

3 lbs. brown sugar

8 eggs

2 lbs. dates

2 lbs. raisins

2 ibs. raisins

1/2 lb. red glazed cherries

1/2 lb. almonds

1/2 lb. walnuts

1/2 lb. mixed peel

1/2 cup cream

1 tsp. soda

1 tsp. salt

2 lbs. flour

1 tsp. vanilla flavoring

1 tsp. rum flavoring

1 tsp. almond flavoring

Cream the butter, add brown sugar gradually, beating until smooth after each addition. Add eggs, one at a time beating well after each egg is added. Sift flour, salt, soda, add alternately to the flour mixture with the cream (flavored with vanilla, rum and almond). Beat this mixture thoroughly, then add cut fruit and nuts which have been floured with some of the flour mixture. Mix thoroughly! Place in cake pans (graduated size) lined with heavy greased brown paper.

Bake 3 to 3 1/2 hours in a 325 degree oven.

1 3/4 cups strong coffee2 cups brown sugarlb. butter tsp.1/2 tsp. allspice



Mix butter, flour. Beat egg yolks slightly, add cream, vanilla, and lemon juice. Beat into butter and flour mixture. Turn on to floured board and shape into balls, size of

big marbles.

Chill overnight. Next day roll each marble into a square about thickness of pie crust. In center of each square put a tsp. of thick jam and a walnut. Moisten edges of pastry and fold into a little turnover.

Bake in 375 degree oven for 10 to 15 minutes. When cooked and cooled, put a tsp. of meringue on top of each turnover and decorate with another walnut. Bake until meringue browns slightly in a slow oven.

#### CHRISTMAS WREATHS OR CUT-OUTS

3 eggs 1 cup butter 2 cups sugar

1 lemon, juice and rind

3 to 3 1/2 cups flour citron and cherries, or colored frosting

Cream butter, add sugar gradually. Then the juice of lemon and grated rind. Beat yolks and whites of eggs separately. Add eggs to mixture.

Gradually work in enough flour to make a mixture firm enough to knead.

Roll out dough into fairly thin sheet and for Christmas wreaths, cut with a donut cutter. For other shapes use cookie cutters such as bells, Xmas

trees, holly leaves, gingerbread men, etc. Place in a greased baking sheet and bake in a 350 degree oven, 15 to 20 mins. Decorate when cool.

#### MAPLE CREAM FUDGE

2 cups brown sugar 1 tbsp. flour 1 tsp. baking



1/2 cup top milk or creain

2 tbsp. butter

salt

Mix all together, bring slowly to a boil while covered. Stir until mixture forms a soft ball in cold water. Add 1 tsp. vanilla and beat until it loses its gloss. Pour into buttered pans that are sprinkled with nuts.



#### **CHOCOLATE FUDGE**

2 cups brown sugar 1/2 cup cream or milk

2 squares unsweetened chocolate

2 tbsp. butter

1/2 tsp. vanilla

nuts

Put all together in pan except for nuts and vanilla, cover and bring slowly to a boil. DO NOT STIR. Boil until reaching the soft ball stage. Cool. Add vanilla, beat until it starts to harden and loses its gloss.

Pour into buttered pan, sprinkled with nuts. Cut into squares.

#### **DIVINITY FUDGE**

2 cups white sugar 1/3 cup syrup 1 cup cold water 1 egg white

1/2 cup chopped walnuts

1 tsp. vanilla

Boil sugar, syrup, water together until a little dropped in cold water forms a firm soft ball. Pour the mixture slowly on to a stiffly beaten egg white beating all the time. Add vanilla; pour nuts in and keep beating until stiff. Pour into buttered pan.




